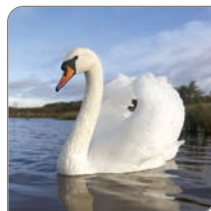


WETLANDS BIRD SPOTTER

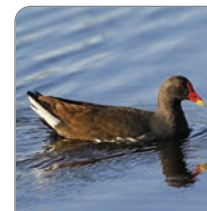
